uniquely designed to address Cheboygan County's economic needs. Our mission aims our financial help squarely on economic development and business assistance.

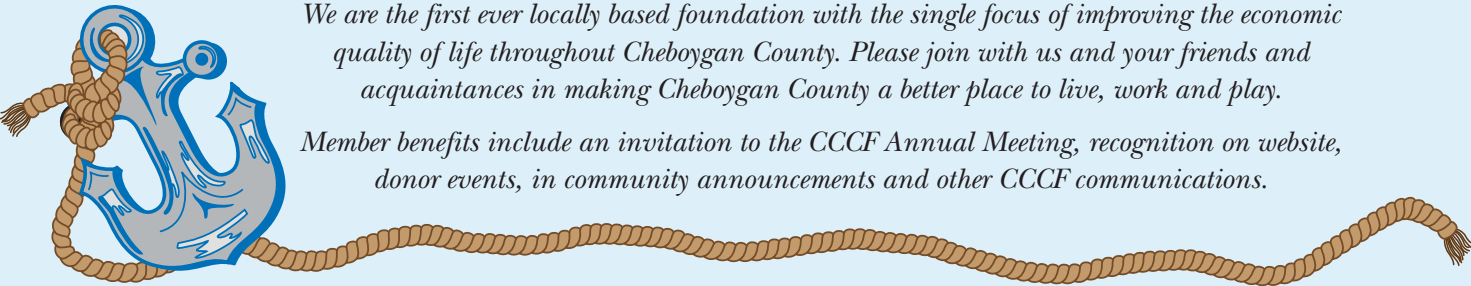

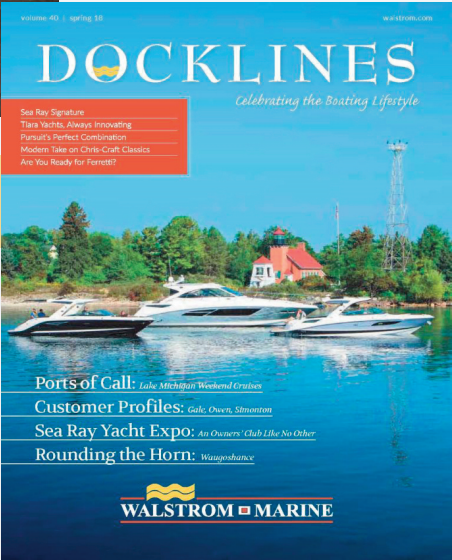

Michigan Main Street Update

Michigan Main Street (MMS) is a program of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Cheboygan is about 95% ready to become a Michigan Main Street community. Objectives of the program are to support and improve Michigan's downtowns and traditional commercial neighborhood districts.

Cheboygan Main Street's primary focus will include a geographic area of streets between Nelson to Mackinaw Avenue and Water to Huron street and will ultimately benefit the entire Great Up North region and beyond.

Along with an army of volunteers the Cheboygan team will focus efforts on the MMS four-point approach. This is a community driven comprehensive strategy that encourages economic development through historic preservation in ways that are appropriate for todays market place.

1. Design: Capitalizing on the assets of the downtown's physical environment, such as historic buildings, creating an inviting atmosphere through renovation and new construction in the context of long-term sustainability.
2. Economic Restructuring: Strengthening the economic base by helping existing businesses and recruiting new ones.
3. Promotion: Market the downtown's unique characteristics to residents, visitors, investors and business owners through advertising, retail activities, special events and marketing campaigns.
4. Organization: The fundamental organizational structure consists of a governing board and four standing committees representing each of the four points.

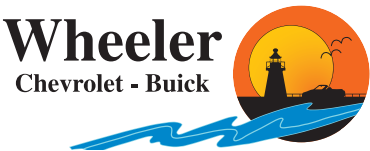
