# RESTORE & ENHANCE THE **CHEBOYGAN CRIB LIGHTHOUSE**

The Cheboygan County Community Foundation, Northern Michigan Toyota Dealers, the City of Cheboygan and the Cheboygan Downtown Development Authority are partnering to renovate the Crib Lighthouse.





In 1984 the lighthouse structure was lifted onto a barge and brought to shore. Today it rests on a concrete pad at the shoreline of Gordon Turner Park.

In 2001, Great Lakes Lighthouse Keepers Association members repaired the lighthouse by caulking all the joints, filling holes that

let in water, and repainting the structure. Now the lighthouse needs a complete restoration.

The Cheboygan County Community Foundation (CCCCF) has taken on the project of completely refurbishing the structure. Fundraising partners and community members are invited to attend and to help move the project forward. The acrylic windows in the lantern room have deteriorated, and need replacing, some of the trim needs repair, two of the tower windows are compromised from lifting the structure off the crib, the lighthouse needs painting, and the interior needs repair. The CCCCf also plans to add additional landscaping, outdoor lighting, and informational signage.

Cheboygan's Crib Lighthouse has been the inspiration and logo for the City of Cheboygan for many years. The 1884 cast iron lighthouse originally sat on a wooden crib in Lake Huron, about a quarter mile offshore, to mark the beginning of the dredged Cheboygan River channel. Through the years, the crib foundation deteriorated, was reinforced, and after many years, again became unsound. The crib had a distinct tilt; and the Coast Guard decided to scrap the lighthouse, dynamite the crib, and replace the marker with a buoy.

The lighthouse had long served as the city "mascot," and was part of the local newspaper masthead and city stationery. The City of Cheboygan reached an agreement with the Coast Guard to have the lighthouse moved to shore, saving it from the scrap heap.
